Annual Surveys

For the past three years, an annual member survey has been conducted in early summer. The feedback has been invaluable for testing member views and helping to develop the credit union.

Another survey will be circulated over the months ahead – your participation would be very helpful and useful. In the meantime, here is a flavour of some of the views from the last two years:





Demand Deposit Accounts – Notification of Change of Rate

For those members with larger savings, no more than \leq 30,000 can be placed in credit union shares with the balance (up to the savings cap of \leq 50,000) held in a demand deposit account. The demand deposit account pays a very small amount of interest, currently 0.01%.

30 days' notice is hereby given that the rate of interest on demand deposit accounts will be reduced from 0.01% to 0.0% with effect from 15 June 2022.

Note that this change of rate does not affect the three- and five-year fixed term deposits. Flexi accounts are designated as share accounts.

Other Credit Union News

Online joining from mobiles has proven very popular with new members – a majority are now joining that way.	DocuSign by email is coming very soon – this will allow credit agreements to be signed while you are on the move.	A number of members have drawn down Green Home Improvement loans since their launch on 1 March. See pscu.ie for details.
The draw for summer courses for teenagers that closed in February drew great interest. The lucky ten winners have won up to €500 each towards summer courses, mainly Cúrsa Gaeilge sa Ghaeltacht, but some other interesting courses too. The office in Earl Place , used mainly by members working for Dublin Bus, has reverted to opening at 9am each morning rather than 10am. This is helping drivers who come off shift after the morning rush hour.

PSCU is not affected by a credit union pension deficit reported widely in the media.	Dividends and loan interest rebates were both added to members' savings just before Christmas – you should see these on your account statements.

Credit Union Current Accounts

With Ulster Bank and KBC writing shortly to their current account customers with termination notices, consider moving to a PSCU current account, Mastercard© debit card and the option of an overdraft. Current accounts are in place almost two years and approaching 1,000 members have signed-up already.
